Founded on the belief that lasting transformation starts with empowering people, MEI combines technical expertise with community-led solutions. Our approach recognizes that climate resilience, food security, and economic opportunity aren't separate issues—they're deeply connected. That's why we design holistic interventions that address root causes and create ripple effects of positive change.

Our Thematic Areas

MEI's work focuses on three interconnected pillars that address both immediate needs and long-term resilience:

Climate Resilience & Disaster Risk Reduction

The Challenge: Nigeria faces escalating climate-related disasters. The devastating 2022 floods affected over 1.4 million people, killed 603 individuals, and destroyed 332,327 hectares of farmland nationwide. Communities lack early warning systems, coping strategies, and the adaptive capacity needed to mitigate flooding impacts.

Our Approach:

- Early flood warning preparation and mitigation training
- Climate-smart agricultural practices
- Community-based disaster risk reduction
- Infrastructure rehabilitation in flood-affected areas
- Emergency response and humanitarian assistance

Agricultural Development & Food Security

The Challenge: Rural communities depend heavily on agriculture for their livelihoods, yet climate change, flooding, and lack of modern farming techniques threaten both food security and economic stability. Farmers need support to rebuild after disasters and adopt resilient farming practices that can withstand environmental pressures.

Our Approach:

- Training on best agricultural practices
- Distribution of quality farm inputs (seeds, seedlings, suckers)
- Animal husbandry support (ruminants, poultry)
- Market linkages and value chain development
- Farmer cooperative strengthening
- Business plan development for agricultural enterprises

Livelihood Empowerment & Economic Recovery

The Challenge: Vulnerable populations—especially women and the elderly—face disproportionate impacts from climate disasters and need targeted support to restore and sustain their livelihoods. Economic empowerment is critical for building community resilience and breaking cycles of poverty.

Our Approach:

- Income-generating activities training
- Productive asset distribution
- Capacity building for cooperatives
- Youth and women entrepreneurship programs
- Livelihood diversification strategies
- Post-disaster economic recovery support

Early Flood Warning & Resilience Building in Ogbaru LGA

Early Flood Warning Preparation, Mitigation Strategies, Resilience and Livelihood Coping Strategies Training of Residents in Selected Communities in Ogbaru LGA, Anambra State

Funded By Irish Aid Emergency Humanitarian Response Fund (EHRF)

Duration October 2023 – January 2024

Target Communities Atani, Aguleri, and Odekpe in Ogbaru Local Government Area, Anambra State

Total Beneficiaries Over 3,125 individuals (1,203 males and 1,922 females including widows, divorcees, elderly, and people with disabilities)

Project Achievements

- 323 direct beneficiaries trained and equipped with comprehensive flood coping strategies
- Increased adaptive capacity through early warning systems training, enabling communities to prepare for and respond to flooding
- Animal husbandry training for selected women in ruminant rearing techniques, creating sustainable income sources
- Agricultural support including agronomic training and distribution of vegetable seeds (Ugu, Okra) and plantain/banana suckers
- Enhanced climate awareness, enabling farmers to recognize rainfall patterns and adjust farming activities accordingly
- Improved early warning capacity, helping communities prepare for and mitigate flood impacts
- Health center rehabilitation at Atani, improving access to healthcare services for the entire community


